#### **Neighbourhood Policing Team**



Your local Neighbourhood Police Team consists of Sergeant Mervyn Priest, PC Val Bryan and PCSO's Michelle Pearson and Samantha Davies. The team is responsible for all related policing matters in Marshfield and Castleton. The next few police surgeries will be held on Sundays 6<sup>th</sup> November and 4<sup>th</sup> December after which (2023) surgeries will be held bi-monthly on the first Sunday at 1pm for an hour. ## Marshfield Bus Campaign (Supported by MCC)



A community engagement exercise collecting over 500 survey results and incorporating the data into a document was presented to our city councillors on 29<sup>th</sup> July. 98% of those surveyed wanted a scheduled bus service to be reinstated in Marshfield and Castleton. The data analysis was taken back to Newport City Council and Newport Transport Ltd by the councillors. Currently the campaign group is waiting to meet with the city councillors to consider any proposals;

### New Dugouts at Marshfield Playing Fields

Previous dugouts at Marshfield Playing Fields were removed for safety reasons as they were old and damaged. Marshfield Community Council financed the installation of new dugouts for the benefit of the community. Unfortunately, they were vandalised shortly after installation.
